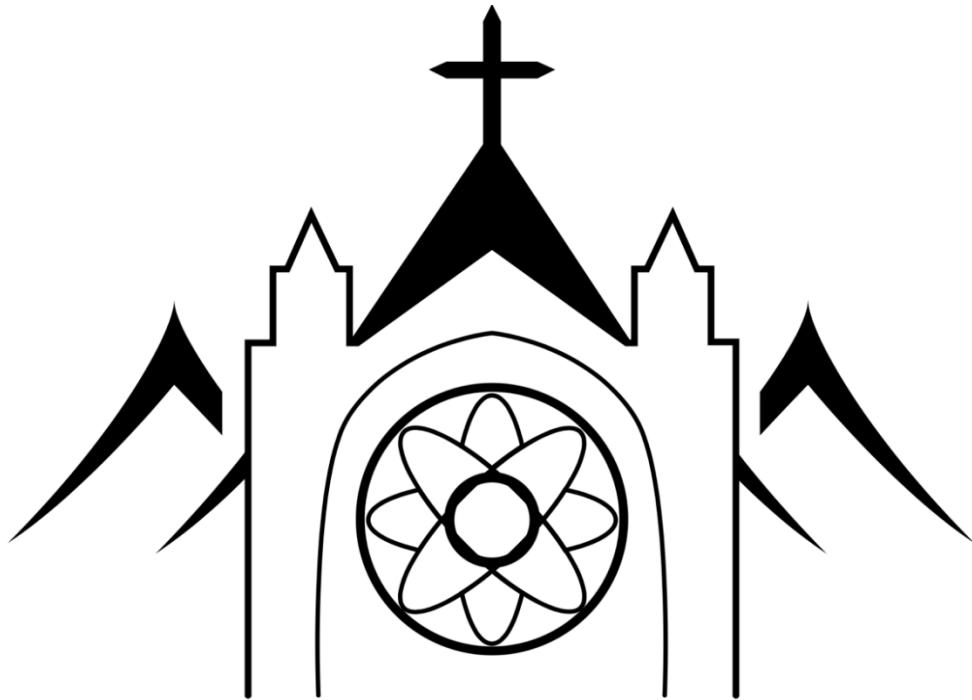

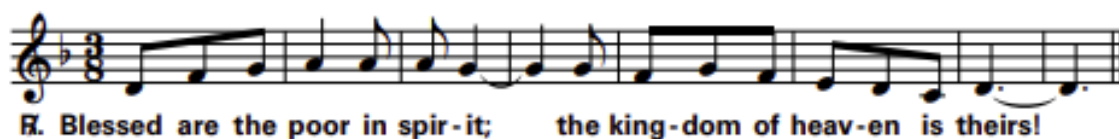

NICENE CREED

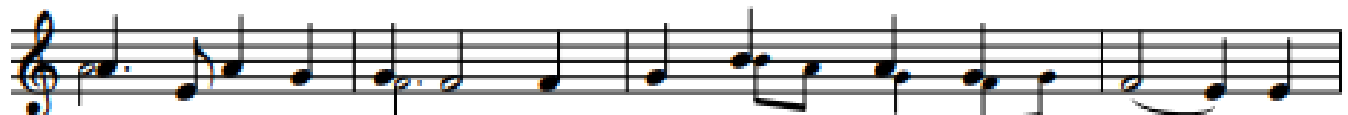

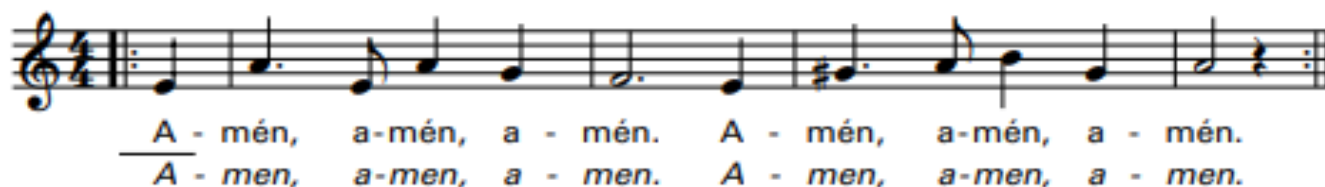

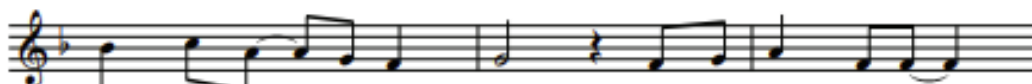
